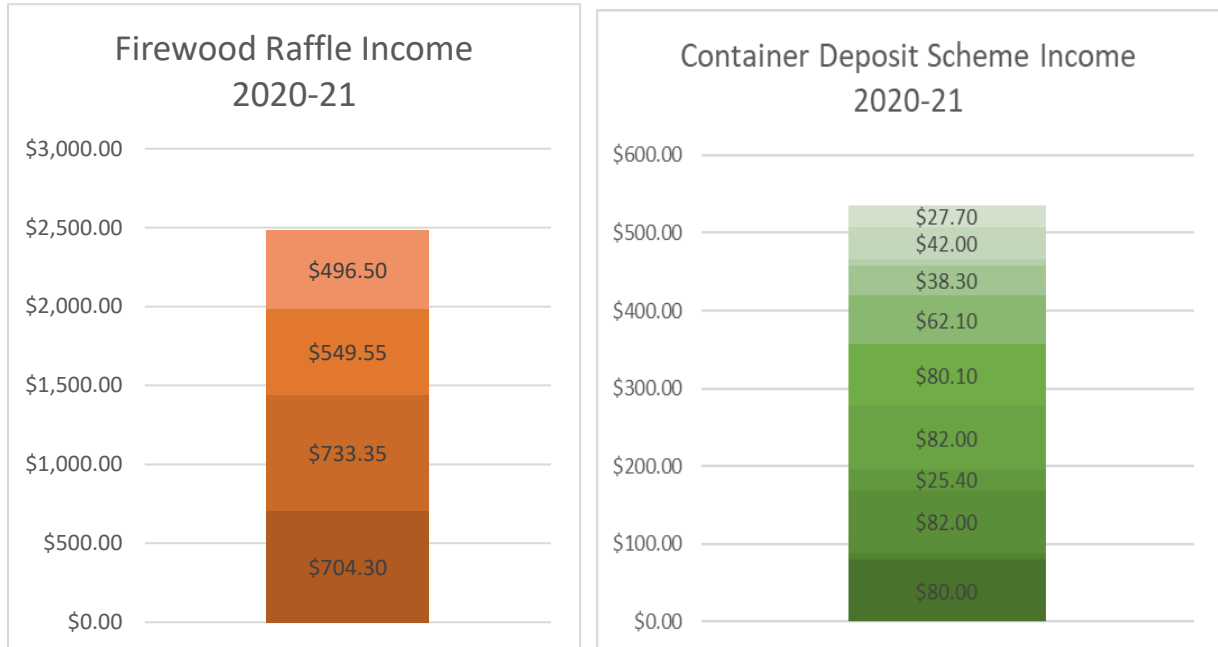
The Shire delay in approving the drainage plan has meant that we are into the rainy season and that is causing further delays.

The retaining wall for the woodworking shop was completed on the 23rd, meaning fill and pad should be starting around the 9th of August. Then comes the slab towards the end of August or early September. The shed has been ordered and the erecting team are scheduled to build it in October.

Basket Case (Neil)



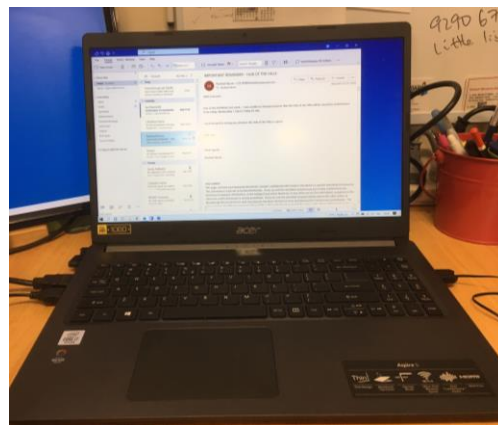

Shire of Mundaring matching grant

MCMS received a \$2,000 grant from the Shire and, as a condition of the grant, provided just over \$2,000 to replace the old PC used by the Secretary as it had deteriorated to the stage where he could make a coffee between power on and email opening. Occasionally it would stop altogether 😞. The new ACER notebook starts up in seconds and works without fuss, both at the Shed and home with different networks. Because it has a solid-state disk (SSD) and an Intel i7 processor, everything happens quickly and with a 15.6" 1920x1080 (HD) screen he can get a clearer view of things.

The other, more expensive, item acquired is an OKI A3 multi-function printer (MFP) which can print, copy and scan documents at up to A3 size. With 3 input trays it can produce A3 and A4 documents without having to manual remove and replace a tray (It's clever enough to know the size of the paper in each tray).
